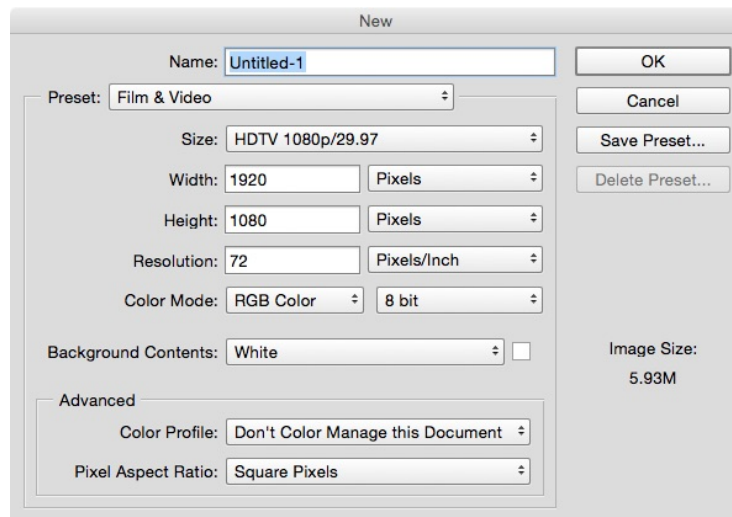
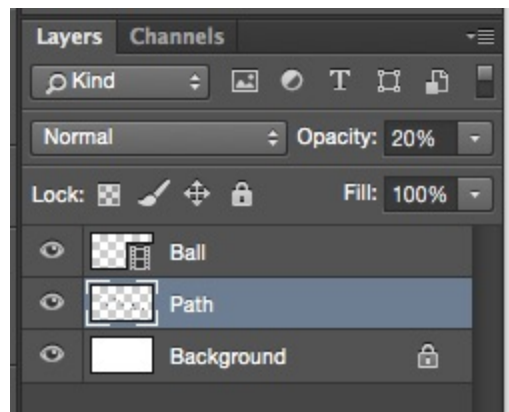


## Setting up Frame by Frame in Photoshop

1. Open Photoshop
2. Go to File > New
  - a. New Menu
    - i. Name: Last Name, First Name - Assignment
    - ii. Preset - Film & Video

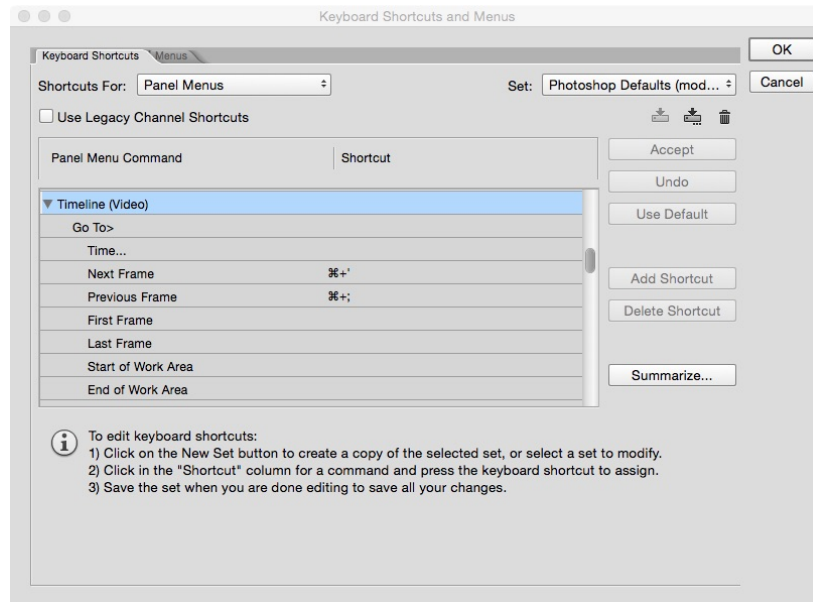


3. Go to View > Deselect Extras
4. Go to Workspace > Motion
5. Go to Layer > New > Layer
  - a. Name it PATH
  - b. Turn the Opacity down to around 20%

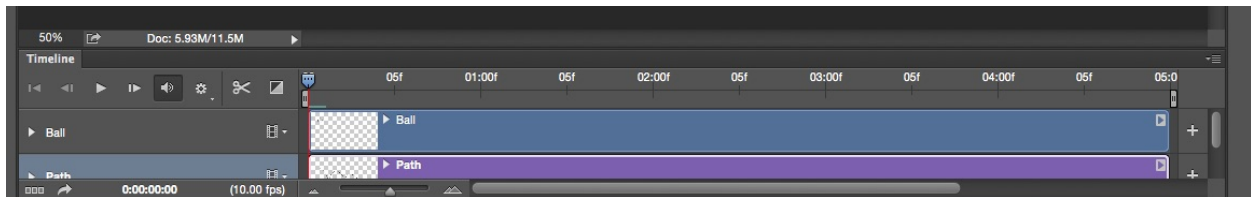


6. Go to Layer > Video Layers > New Blank Video Layer
  - a. Name it whatever it is you are animating
  - b. This layer is used to create your motion
7. \*For Still Images in your composition go to Layer > New > Layer

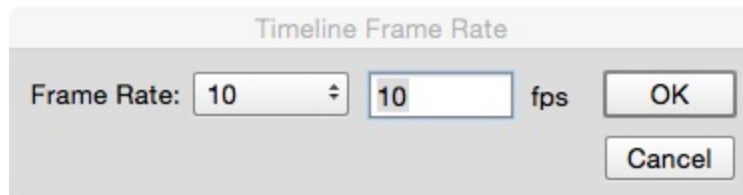
- a. Name it whatever it is
  - b. These layers remain stationary in your animation
8. If your your Shortcuts are not working Go to Edit > Keyboard Shortcuts
- a. Set Next Frame to Command + ‘
  - b. Set Previous Fram to Command + ;
  - c. Set Enable Onion Skins to Command +O
  - d. Select OK



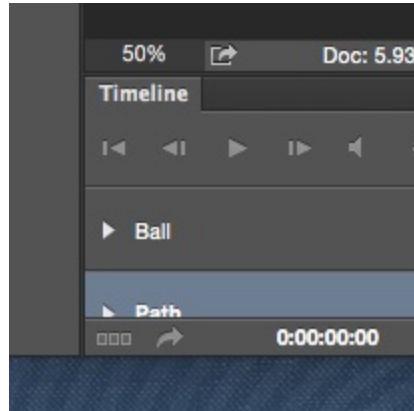
9. Go to the Drop-Down List Icon on your Timeline Panel



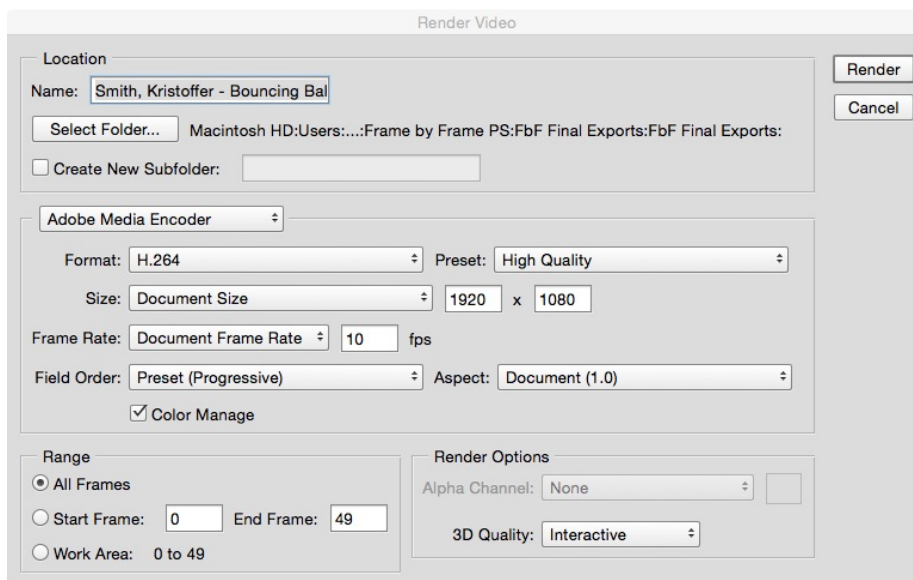
- a. Select Set Timeline Frame Rate
- b. Set the FPS to 10 frames per second
- c. Select OK



10. Now Move your playhead to the beginning of your timeline and you are ready to draw frame by frame animation
11. Remember to always select the layer that you want to edit in your Layers Panel
12. After you have drawn each frame to render Go to the curved arrow on the lower left corner of the Timeline Panel



13. If you named your project appropriately in the beginning it will already be titled properly.
  - a. Tell your project where to save
  - b. Make sure Create New Sub folder is not checked
  - c. Then Select OK to finish your animation



- d. This will create a .MP4 File. This .MP4 is what you should submit to Google Drive in the appropriate Folder
